FY20 started off with a future of reduced funding from ILETSB due to the change in the collection of the Traffic Surcharge Fund. By the end of the fiscal year, this affected us by reducing our State approved funding by ¹/₄ or \$102,176.13 which was budgeted at the start of the fiscal year.

If things could not have gotten more difficult, in January 2020, the Country was hit with a COVID19 pandemic which shut down all in-person training from March to the end of the fiscal year. We had to adjust to webinars for training and reach out to our members and concentrate on certifying their in-service training to assist them.

We are also continuing to assist our members to adjust to the State mandates in training that are becoming more and more time consuming. The types of classes we must schedule to make sure we offer them the opportunity to be able to meet the mandate needs for their Department Officers.

Fiscal Year 2020 was another year with all the State's mandated training requirements kicking in for Departments. To assist our members in meeting these requirements, we continue to have their inhouse training certified for mandate coverage and we enter it into the LETM database to provide certificates. As of June 2020, 29 Departments were utilizing a monthly on-line computer-based training program which must be certified monthly and I expect the number of Departments using this training to expand in the future. Each Departments on-line monthly training is entered into LETM as an individual class which has resulted in a significant increase of data entry on the part of our Administrative Assistant. I anticipate this along with additional in-service classes certified to cover mandates will greatly increase and will cause additional data entry work on our part.

In FY2020 we hosted 401 classes that totaled 1.961 hours of training. A decrease from FY19 mostly

due to COVID restrictions. There was a good report on overall training compared to the situation the State payments presented us with. Upon an analysis of these figures, we show an offering of more multiple day courses instead of one-day courses to keep the training cost for overtime down for our members and to offer more 'quality' courses instead of courses just to increase our overall numbers. In FY2020 we had additional members incorporate their in-service training into being certified and entered into LETM by us. This procedure added additional courses and man trained hours to our totals for this fiscal year with only requiring a small input of additional manpower on our part and giving Departments the opportunity to take advantage of the many services we can provide to them.

The Tri-River Advisory Board has been actively involved in the management of the MTU. The Advisory Board meets monthly, to ensure that necessary high-quality training is provided to our member agencies. (We continued to meet every month by switching to ZOOM meetings.) We have received excellent support from our member Departments, especially in providing facilities to hold our classes. Most of our classes are conducted in facilities controlled or contracted through our members which has kept our rental cost down to \$0.00 for the fiscal year. We thank all of those who have supported our training efforts.

Our FY2020 audit was completed in September of 2020 by the accounting firm of Wermer, Rogers, Doran & Ruzon LLC. The Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board, (ILETSB) allowed MTU's to contract with their choice of accounting firms for this audit as long as they met the standards to comply with handling governmental agency audits. This firm is from the local area, Joliet, and has completed numerous governmental audits at the county and local governmental level. A copy of their final report is available upon request.

In Fiscal Year 2020, we continued to incorporate internet-based software into our daily activities. This included incorporating standard forms into an Adobe format for fill in the blank use by our members. We have further moved along with the use of our training data base along with using email as the primary form of contact and announcements of our courses. We upgraded our web site to accept registration requests as well.

At the conclusion of FY20, Tri-River had a balance (reserve) of excess Local Funds, from unused local dues, in the amount of \$45,938.77 which was collected for FY2020 above our hard match requirement and excess cash added to balance our year end budget. Any excess funds will be held as a contingency fund, reserved for any future emergency expenses or training needs.

In FY2020 we had another full year (we are going on 12 years of handling these funds) of assisting the Training Board in processing payments of training vouchers for the Chicago Police Department after we received Training Board approval. The Training Board would issue us the funds for Chicago's In-Service Training Grant, and we would then pay their training related bills once approval was received from the Board and the Chicago Police Department. A total of \$400,000 was received for this fund and \$209,174.8535 was distributed during FY 2020 which left a balance of \$320,061.38 (includes carry over from FY19) for this program in 43 different transactions that had to be processed.

The ILETSB's CIT funds of \$130,360 from FY15 were turned over us for administration of these

funds per an agreement signed with the ILETSB. During FY20, the fund started with a balance of \$93,816.10 and ended the fiscal year with a balance of \$51,651.87 with 20 transactions during the year that were processed for the Training Board.

In Fiscal Year 2020, we had \$108,731.13 in grant sponsored courses. Homeland Security Grants \$19,099.16, IDOT Grants \$34,060.67, Audit Grant \$15,000.00 and CIT Grants \$40,571.30. Due to classes being cancelled from March- - June, we did receive permission to carry our Homeland Security Grant funds over into the next fiscal year that we were approved for and not be able to spend.

Due to the unknown future on funding from the State level, our board raised the yearly dues effective FY21, the increase was from \$70 to \$100 per full time officer and \$30 to \$70 for part-time officers. The old fee was in place over eight years from what can be determine by our records.

On behalf of the Tri-River Staff and myself, it is a privilege to serve the Chiefs, Sheriffs, and Police Officers of the Tri-River Police Training Region, MTU# 16, and the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board during Fiscal Year 2020. We look forward to having an exciting new year and challenging Fiscal Year 2021.
